- **4. Approval of Agenda:** Councilor Velma Johnson made a motion to approve the agenda. Councilor Janice Anderson seconded the motion. A voice vote was taken. All present voted aye and there was no opposition. Motion passed; the agenda was approved unanimously.

- b. **Chief Kenneth Davis** Midfield now has an ambulance transporting and backing up RPS which is an Ambulance company and more critical patients. There is a press release on Monday at the fire station. The Fire Dept and Police helped welcome the kids back to school.
- c. **Mike Lloyd-**. Working on getting quotes for the Midfield Public Library. Also posting lots that need to be cleaned and cut.

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ORDINANCE NO. 2024.60

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE HANDLING OF FOOD BY PERSONS, COMPANIES AND OR BUSINESSES BOTH FOR PROFIT AND NOT FOR PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS

Sec.1 Purpose of the ordinance.

The Purpose of this ordinance is to protect the health and safety of the public from sickness or disease which may occur from consumption of unsanitary, contaminated, or adulterated food and beverages.

Sec 2. Be It as ordained as follows;

Sec.3. Right of entry of health officer, etc.

(a) In order to carry out the provisions of this ordinance, the city building inspector, county health department, the health officer and their duly authorized representatives shall have the right at all times, while in the discharge of their duties, to enter upon or into the premises of any person engaged in the production, manufacture, preparation, storage, serving, disposing of, distributing, selling, giving away, or exposing for sale in the city any article of food or beverage used or intended for human consumption, and refusal on the part of that person to allow

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the inspection as may be necessary and proper for the enforcement of this chapter may be punished by the revocation of the permit of that person.

(b) The city building inspector, county health department, the health officer and their duly authorized representatives shall have the right and it shall be their duty to enter and have full access, egress and ingress to all places where any article of food, beverage or other liquids used or intended for human consumption are produced, manufactured, prepared, stored, kept, served, disposed of, distributed, sold or exposed for sale or give away, and to all wagons or other vehicles, cars or conveyances of every kind used for the transportation or delivery of food, beverages or other liquids for the purpose of sale, give away or distribution in the city.

Sec. 4. Hindering officers in performance of duties.

It shall be unlawful for any person to impede, obstruct, hinder, or otherwise prevent or attempt to prevent any duly authorized officer in the performance of his or her duties in collecting samples of food or beverage or otherwise.

Sec.5. Sanitary permit for handlers, producers, etc., of food—Required.

It shall be unlawful for any person to prepare, sell, offer or expose for sale, exchange, give away, deliver, dispose of or have in possession, custody or control, in the city, with intent to sell, offer or expose for sale, exchange, gift or delivery,

any meat, prepared food, vegetable, beverage, liquid or other article used or intended for use as food for human beings, without a valid, unsuspended and unrevoked sanitary permit issued by the health officer, pursuant to regulations of the state committee of public health.

Sec.6. Same—Prerequisite to issuance of business license, permission, or city authorization.

No business license, permission or authorization shall be issued, given, or granted by the City of Midfield to a person to engage in the business of producing, handling, selling, serving, giving away or distributing any article of food, liquid or beverage used for or intended for human consumption in the city unless the applicant for that business license holds an unsuspended and unrevoked sanitary permit issued by the health officer.

Sec.7. Enforcement of this ordinance.

It shall be the duty of the city building inspector, or county health department to cause the building, store, place or premises used in connection with the manufacture, preparation, storage, serving, disposal of, distributing, selling, exposing for sale exchange, gifting or delivering, in the city, any article of food, beverage or other liquids used or intended for human consumption, to be inspected

from time to time and to see that the provisions and requirements of this chapter are constantly complied with.

Sec.7. Effective date of this ordinance.

This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon it passage and publication as required by law.
